Food supply/Food for vulnerable people/Local action/Funding 7 April 2020

Overview

• The Government has published guidance for on the <u>Small Business Grant Fund and the Retail</u>, <u>Hospitality and Leisure Grant Fund</u>:

Central Government will provide funding to Local Authorities that are responsible for business rate billing. Those Local Authorities will contact eligible businesses to arrange payment of the grants. The business ratepayer will be contacted and receive the funds if they are eligible.

- Free School Meal e-vouchers in England will now cover the school holidays
- Councils in England given new powers to hold public meetings remotely and among other things planning committee meetings will still be able to take place

Food supply and diverse outlets

Producers

- Farms to Feed Us have <u>created an online database</u> to include smaller scale farmers, dairies, wineries, bakeries and independent shops that will now sell directly to consumers
- The NFU is <u>asking farmers to communicate any business critical issues</u> amidst Covid-19 so they can be collated and reported to Defra
- The Soil Association have frozen the planned price increase for their Certifications and will review end
 of September 2020

Securing food for vulnerable people

School Vouchers

- The introduction of Free School Meals in England will not cover those receiving Universal Infant Free School Meals. The government guidance makes clear that the policy of free school meals for all infants under the age of 8 will not apply during the Covid-19 outbreak.
- Food for Life have expressed their concerns about the vouchers <u>here</u>. They are regularly updated their work on this area <u>here</u>
- Over 200,000 children in London alone are at risk of hunger won't qualify for the Government's free school meal vouchers. The Mayor's Fund of London is calling for donations to support young Londoners

BRIGHTON

• <u>Infinity Foods Coop</u> has teamed up with <u>Zedify</u> to offer home delivery services and the 'Infinity Food Box'

CARDIFF

Wild Thing Cafe have exceeded their £2,000 goal to raise money for Wild Thing Emergency Community
Meals, a free delivery service for those in need with two options: prepared food that can be stored and
reheated or raw ingredients and recipes for those who enjoy cooking and have access to cooking
facilities.

DEVON

 Short Film: Wicked Leeks meets Food in Community to hear how food banks are continuing to deliver fresh produce, despite public donations dwindling

DORSET

• Bridport resident has set up a Meals on Wheels service and is cooking 80 meals a day for the elderly

FORTH VALLEY

 Podcast: <u>Coronavirus and Food in the Community</u> created by NHS Forth Valley, gives handwashing and personal hygiene guidance to individuals and volunteers that are shopping and delivering food and medicines to those self isolating at home.

LEEDS

• Leeds we have a well-coordinated volunteering response with Voluntary Action Leeds in partnership with Leeds City Council delivering the Community Care Volunteer scheme across all 33 wards in Leeds. In

each ward they are working with a locally trusted organization (LTO) that acts as a hub to facilitate volunteering activity. All volunteers sign up through a <u>central online hub</u>, where they undertake online training and are then allocated out to the ward hubs. Those with current DBS checks will be allocated to specific roles and options for others to get a DBS.

- <u>Doing Good Leeds have produced guidance</u> on being a good neighbour to protect both those volunteering and those seeking support
- Leeds City Council, Leeds Food Aid Network, Leeds Community Foundation, FareShare Yorkshire, Rethink Food and other partners have coordinated an emergency food response.

LINCOLN

- St George's C of E Community Primary School in Gainsborough has designed a 'Grab n Go' food station to feed the school and the local community more. They have painted white lines 2 meters apart on the path to ensure social distancing. Anyone in the community can help themselves to a food package for only £1.00. For local people who are self-isolating, elderly or vulnerable, two 'school dads' who are taxi drivers, and several staff, are running a delivery service. Isolators and elders are being identified through the two local churches. Food parcels are funded out of the school budget and in the first week, over 100 parcels have gone out.
- Washingborough Academy are providing hot meals to all children who would otherwise have free school
 meals and offering a delivery service to all members of the community who are over 70 and self isolating

LONDON

- Here is a crowdsourced list of essential goods providers with a delivery service in London
- Tower Hamlets Food Partnership have been keeping a log of the local food situation:
 - o Food banks remain open
 - There are many schools offering food bags to children living in households in receipt of benefits.
 The council has a <u>list</u> of these schools. Free school meals are being replaced with meals for collection/deliver or £15 to redeem at supermarkets. The official voucher scheme has not begun yet
 - o Tower Hamlets Food Partnership has a list of local food businesses you deliver on their website
 - o Local Mutual Aid groups: <u>Bow, Royal Docks, Tower Hamlets</u>
- Wandsworth Food Partnership have also been sending out updates:
 - <u>Wandsworth Covid-19 Direct Relief Fund</u> has been launched to provide aid to local residents and reimburse volunteers who are purchasing and delivering goods to those in need
 - They are looking to develop a scheme to support local food businesses and restaurants whilst feeding vulnerable people in the community
 - o A list has been compiled of what local charities, businesses and mutual aid groups are doing
- Good Food in Greenwich are keen to set up a food box scheme in collaboration with as many local food businesses as possible. They are currently in ideas stage but are keen to here from local organisations who'd be interested in getting involved
- Colville, Notting Dale & Norland Wards in Kensington & Chelsea have <u>set up a mutual aid website</u> which includes some very useful information about safeguarding

The London Association of City Farms and Community Gardens and Social Farms and Gardens have written to funders and government, calling for more support and access to the equivalent Small Business Grants for community organisations.
