Overview

- The Commons Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (EFRA) Select Committee has <u>launched an inquiry</u> into the UK's food supply during the Covid-19 crisis, including access to healthy food during periods of self-isolation and how disruptions in the food supply chain should be managed. <u>The deadline for responses to its call for evidence is 1 May 2020</u>
- The Scottish Government has announced that families unable to access food as a result of the Covid-19
 crisis will receive support from Local Authorities with £30 million of new investment from the Scottish
 Government Food Fund.
- The Chancellor has <u>committed a further £350m</u> to support the devolved administration in Wales to tackle coronavirus.
- The UK Government has announced new measures to improve small business access to the <u>Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CBILS)</u>, after many SMEs said they could not secure the emergency loans which they urgently need
- The FAO Urban Task Force is calling on local government officials to map out actions led by city administrations and local governments to protect food systems to identify local governments' needs and challenges. Find the questionnaire here

Securing food for vulnerable people

- Former Olympics director Chris Townsend <u>has been appointed</u> to lead the government's shielding programme to protect those at highest risk from coronavirus in England.

New Research

- The Food Foundation have published its <u>latest research</u> into food insecurity during Covid-19, which revealed 1.5 million people (3%) have gone a whole day without eating since the lockdown came into effect, and 7.1 million people (14%) say someone in their household has had to reduce or skip meals because they could not access or afford sufficient sustenance. - Food Foundation is leading <u>calls to government</u> to establish a National Food Aid Task Force led by Defra which can support local authorities to significantly scale up welfare assistance schemes and food support for vulnerable groups that are self-isolating
- The Independent Food Aid Network sent a letter to the DWP on 8 April which reported some of its members recording a 300% increase in need throughout March 2020 compared to March 2019.

Free School Meals

- The Government has also confirmed that funding for the National School Breakfast Programme in England will stay in place via Magic Breakfast and Family Action and schools can still <u>apply to the scheme</u>. You can find the updated guidance <u>here</u> (scroll down)
- Edenred has <u>written to all schools</u> in England to say that the Department for Education has agreed to allow them to place an order for a family to cover a period of up to four weeks in one order (£60 instead of £15 on a four weekly cycle or £30 for a two weekly cycle), thereby reducing the administration burden on schools and further reducing the volume of visitors in the ordering platform at any one time.
- 6 April The Secretary of State for Education agreed to extend the Free School Meal eligibility criteria in England so that many families with No Recourse to Public Funds can access support during the Covid19 outbreak.

BRIGHTON

CARDIFF

- Restaurants and cafes in Cardiff have joined forces and upscaled to produce meals for the NHS, as part
 of the Feed the Heath Campaign. They are raising money for the efforts here.
- Cardiff Delivers webpage of local businesses delivering during the lockdown

CORNWALL

• To comply with social distancing, Cafe CHAOS' <u>community fridge in Truro has become 'fridgeless'</u> and instead is housed outside the building for people to grab a food box from the carpark.

COUNTY DURHAM

- In Witton le Wear, a village in County Durham: Two local butchers, Robert Chambers and Castle Bank Butchers, are now offering free delivery services
- Woodhalls Green Grocer, Stanhope, is delivering local produce
- Local pub, <u>The Victoria Inn</u>, has set up a food bank and a delivery service in collaboration with the local milkman for milk, eggs, beer, potatoes to local residents (most promotion through Facebook)
- Railway Paddock Smallholding is providing local veg box deliveries

DUNDEE

- Dundee Free School Meal set up: A direct weekly payment of £11.25 per child will be made into the
 accounts of families who qualify, where the Council holds bank details (families without stored bank
 account details will be contacted).
 - Those eligible include: any child in a nursery who would normally get free school meals. Pupils in P1 P3, who receive the school clothing grant, P4 S6 will be based on free school meals entitlement. Vouchers will be available as a safety net in case bank details for some families cannot be confirmed. Payments will be backdated until 23rd March, the date from which the Council was unable to provide the normal free school meals service.

EDINBURGH

LONDON

- The London Growth Hub has launched a <u>new portal</u> to support London-based businesses and employers to manage and mitigate their exposure to COVID-19. The portal includes factsheets, guides, information on Government support and the option to book business advisor appointments for one to one support.
- Tower Hamlets:

 - Blog: <u>Covid</u>, <u>Food and Community Resilience</u>
 - A Plate for London is <u>raising £50,000 to feed school children</u> in Tower Hamlets during the Easter Holidays. Five locations across Tower Hamlets are serving hot food to take away from 8 - 17 April (each hub serving 300 meals). The locations are: Brady Centre, Harford Multicentre, St Paul's Way, Gayton Classroom 1, Spotlight.
 - LBTH has <u>a list of schools</u> who are offering food bags to children living in households in receipts of benefits.
 - Manorfield Primary school is <u>fundraising for its own emergency response</u>.
 - Women's Inclusive Team are running a Meals on Wheels service by referral or in response to calls from vulnerable residents. Bike Works delivers the food

NEWTON

Newton Community Fridge is now delivering food surplus directly to those in need

MILTON KEYNES

 Milton Keynes Community Fridge has partnered with FareShare, Community Action, the Council and other charities. The Old Bath Community Centre is no longer open but is being used as a distribution centre for pre-packaged food on Thursdays. They receive 100 parcels from Fareshare to distribute weekly.

SURREY

Mid Surrey Community Fridges have physically closed and instead 5 community hubs have been set up
in Mole Valley area where teams take deliveries of surplus food. The surplus is then bagged and
distributed to those in need in the community. They have partnered with the local council, DWP, Primary
Care Trust and other local community charities.

MID WALES

New community project, Planna Fwyd, in Dyfi Valley is organising a variety of food production initiatives
via Zoom, including lessons for first time crop growers and sending out seeds to families so they can
grow their own. The group also plans to organise a land army of volunteers to work on farms. The
community project was born after the existing community groups, Mach Maethlon, joined forces with a
local mutual aid group to combat food shortages.
